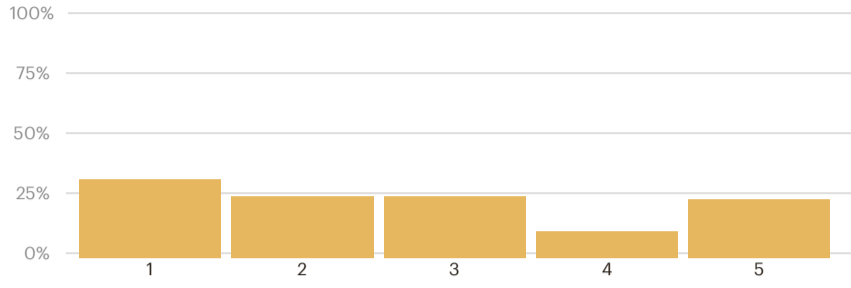

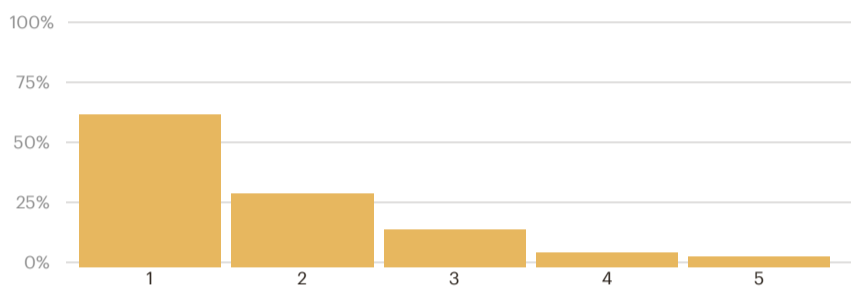
Question 1 has 98 answers (Range) Avg rating: 2.7

“1. Install stop signs on Church St at 28th St to improve pedestrian and traffic safety?”



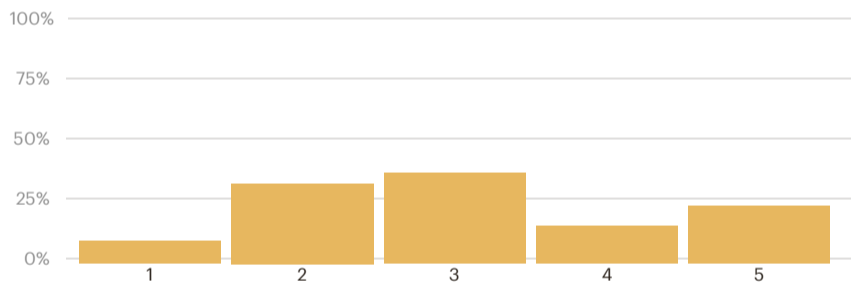
Question 2 has 102 answers (Range) Avg rating: 1.8

“2. Fill empty storefronts?”



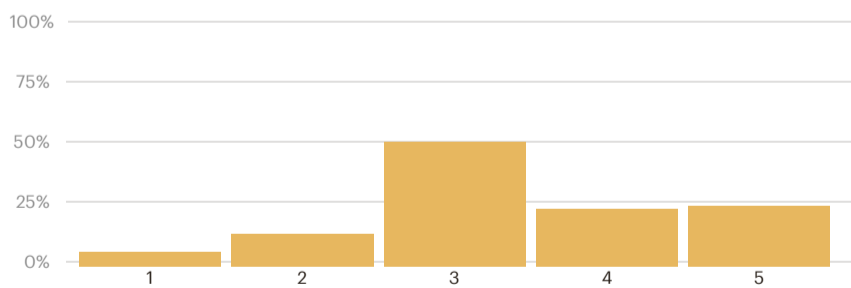
Question 3 has 101 answers (Range) Avg rating: 3.1

“3. Organize a sampling tour night to promote local restaurants (Supper Noe)?”



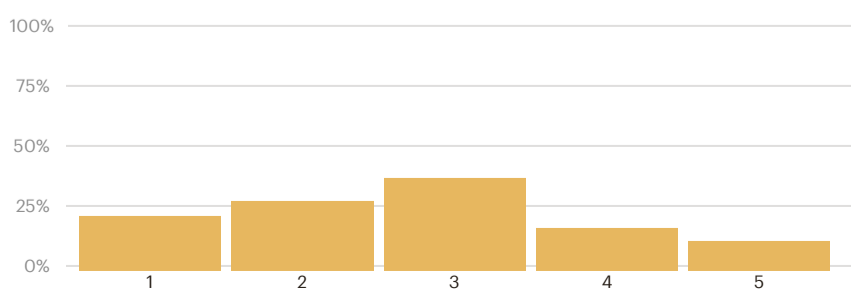
Question 4 has 100 answers (Range) Avg rating: 3.4

“4. Finish the Day St mural along the Upper Noe Rec Center wall?”



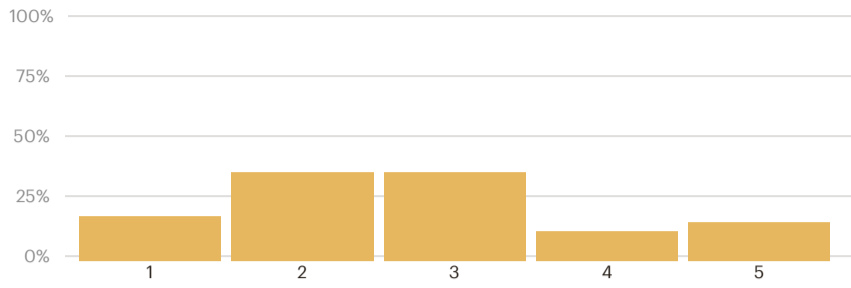
Question 5 has 100 answers (Range) Avg rating: 2.7

“5. Repave both Church St and 30th St along the MUNI tracks?”



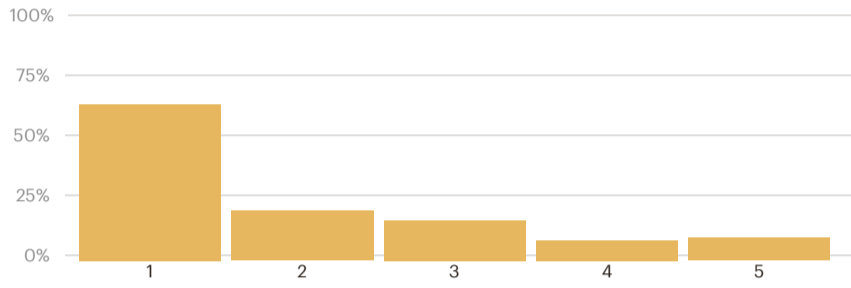

“6. Improve lighting on the streets between 30th St and Randall?”



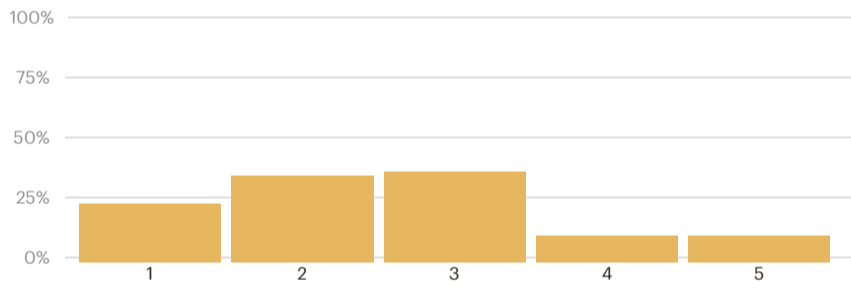

“7. Preserve J-Church stops, parking and access to institutions, shops and restaurants on Church St?”



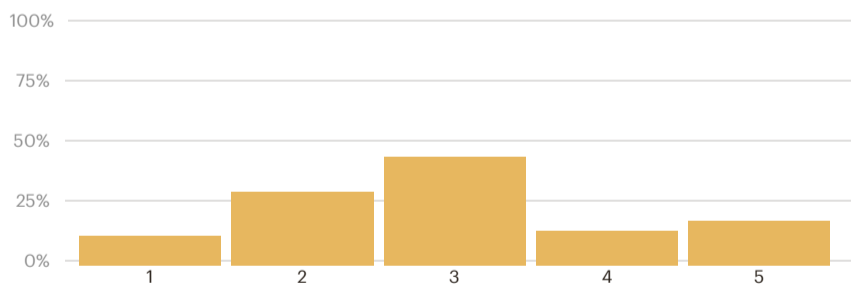

“8. Trim trees to improve street lighting on Church St?”



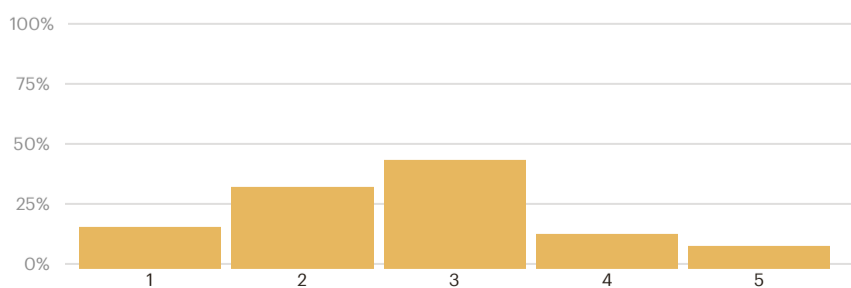

**PARKLETS**

- Uma Casa outdoor dining structure blocks the view. I don't want to take from Uma Casa but this is really dangerous
- Parklets were useful for Covid situations. However, most of them are like shacks and poorly built. They leave an ugly streetside impression to the passerby. It is time to dismantle ... the ones that are an eye sore.
- More outdoor dining/parklets
- Make Church Street a destination. Add more parklets and sidewalk seating for strong community feeling.

**PUBLIC SAFETY**

- Repaint crosswalks
- Crosswalk and stop sign at Dolores & Day.
- Stop sign at Duncan and Church.
- Better traffic enforcement throughout Noe Valley
- Keep parked cars off sidewalks
- Help get more police units.
- More police patrol, especially at night
- support to local businesses and their employees when they are vandalized/victimized.
- Make streets safer at night - organize an install security lighting project for each street. When streets are well lit, burglaries go down, security goes up.
- While more street lighting is good, the LED lights placed on the streets are so bright, they shine into our homes. Perhaps a softer LED light would work better. There is constant light in our homes at night, even with the shades down.

**HOMELESSNESS**

- Increase safety: many more unhoused people and random men making me feel unsafe in my own neighborhood.
- Prevent homeless encampments.
- Keep sidewalks free of homeless squatters.
- More visible outreach program for our own homeless population.
- Look at where supportive housing could be built in Upper Noe,
- Liaise with local groups and City agencies to tackle the problem of homelessness in our neighborhood and throughout the City

## STREETS / TRANSPORTATION / INFRASTRUCTURE

- Advocate for cleaner streets.
- Better trash removal at public cans.
- Pick up of trash on the streets and sidewalks.
- Improve recycling and compost and remove litter from the streets.
- Remove graffiti.
  
- Make public transportation and bicycling safe and inviting
- Address Cheney/Randall juggernaut due to Lyft bike installation
  
- 30th street paving, new tracks, under grounding Utilities, and replacement sewer.
- Repair roads (eg Noe St between 29th and Valley)
- Repave Noe St from 30th St to 26th St.
- Pave Noe between 26th and 30th.
  
- Sidewalk repair on 30th between Sanchez & Church.
- Remind neighbors to fix sidewalks with tripping/falling hazards, especially tree caused cracks.
  
- Get rid of telephone poles, bury electrical lines.
- Underground PG&E cables in Noe Valley.
  
- Put the benches back on 30th at church at the MUNI stop for 24 and J, and the 36 across the street.
  
- Ensure direct J service to downtown continues.
- Keep the J in the tunnel for a 1-seat ride from Upper Noe to downtown
- Keep full J Church service straight through to downtown.
  
- Work with FSS, City agencies, and other interested groups to ensure the continuing success of Slow Sanchez
- Return Sanchez to a normal street to reduce the extraordinary amount of traffic displaced to Noe.

## BEAUTIFICATION

- Plant NATIVE trees and shrubbery to provide food and shelter for our local fauna.
- Increase tree planting with native California trees.
- Get more trees planted/more concrete removed for people to plant plants/trees/etc along the street.
- Tree planting in open cuts on 30th St. where there once were trees.

## CIVIC ENGAGEMENT

- Encourage diversity. Speak out against injustice.
- Encourage citizens to help others in need of help,.
  
- Pick up trash, report dangerous conditions, participate as much as possible in community gatherings.
- Help keep Noe, Fairmont, and Glen Park neighborhoods clean, welcoming, civil, livable, for all ages, economic levels, and cultures.
  
- Keep aware of troubling situations and help solve problems without involving city agencies whenever possible.
- Keep aware of issues in neighborhoods nearby like Bernal Heights, Mission, and Diamond Heights.
- Provide greater connection between the two Noe neighborhood associations.
  
- Post updates on the bulletin boards on Slow Sanchez -inform people and get more people involved. Continue this good community outreach

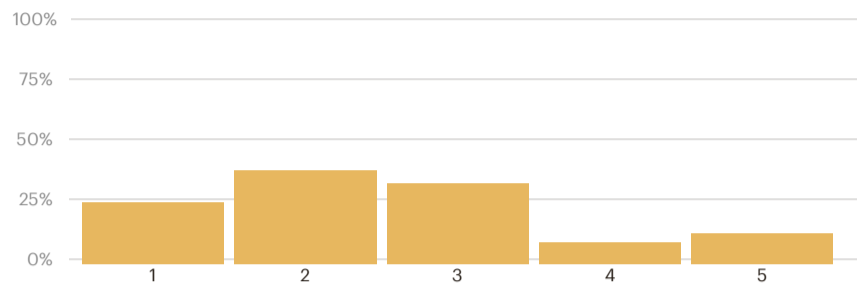

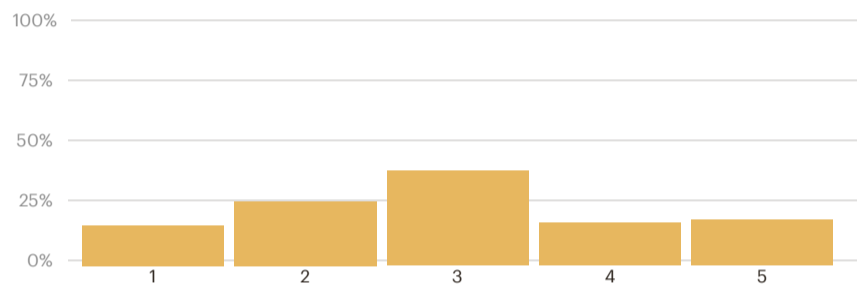

**“13. Utility Pole Banners and Flower Baskets”**



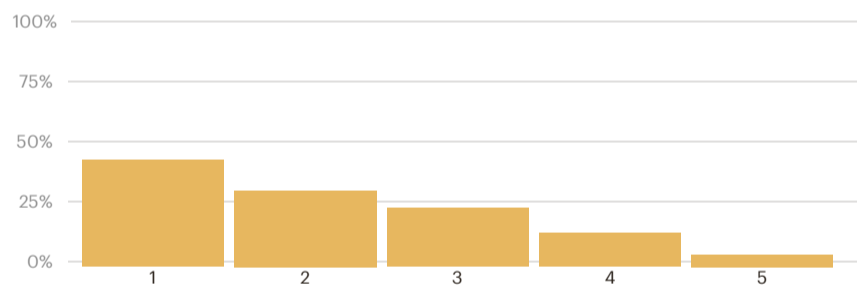

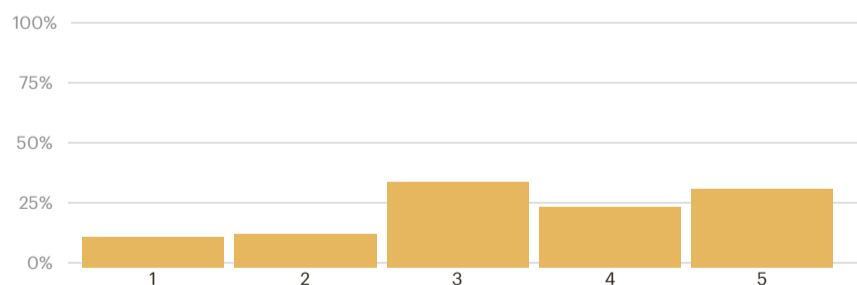

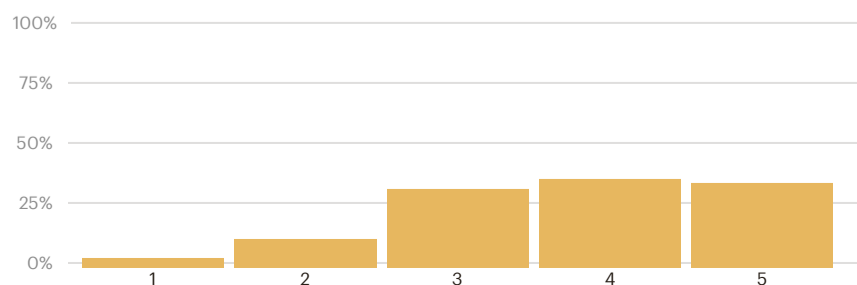


**“16. Kiosks welcoming visitors and displaying retail, history and event information”**



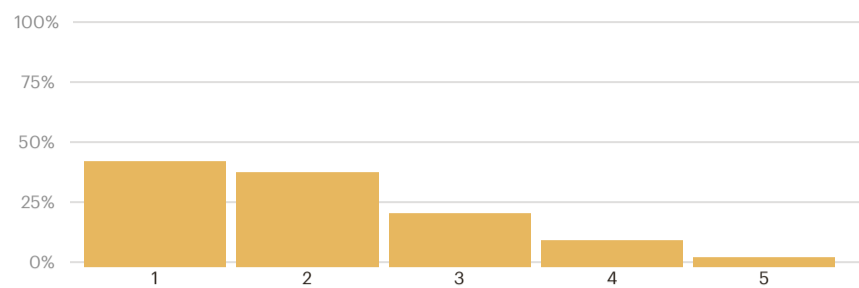

**“17. Medallions - painted stencils displaying retail logos and local history.”**



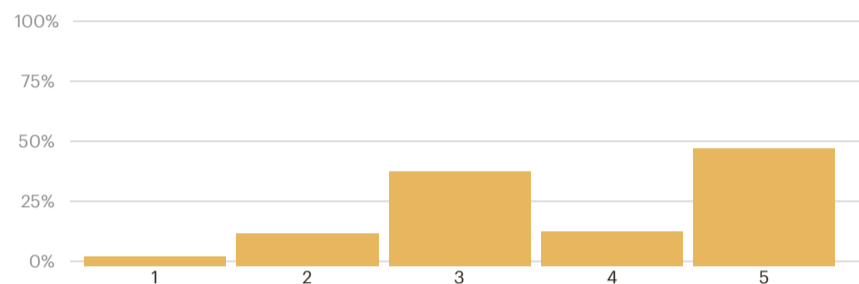

“18. Decorative lighting along the commercial corridor, especially during the holidays.”



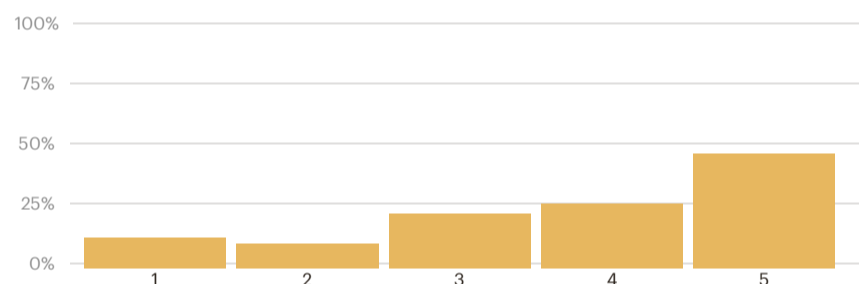

“19. Billboard Messaging - welcoming and informing”



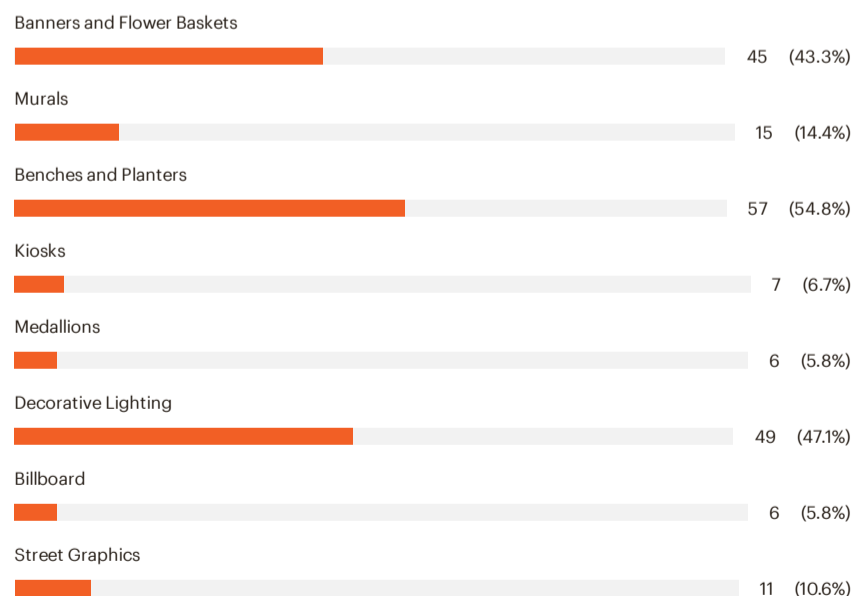

“22. Please provide any comments and/or ideas here:”

- Since Upper Noe is largely a neighborhood-serving retail area, is branding really that important?
- How about a theme look? The neighborhood will look more cohesive and attractive/inviting.
- "The current 'brand' of the neighborhood is low-key, unassuming and neighborly. Improvements to generate more traffic must preserve that brand and avoid any glitz that simply cheapens it.
- Support neighborhood businesses.
- Parking will probably always be an issue and if we want more visitor traffic, we will probably need more parking meters.
- Let's not lose any more parking spaces.
- Smaller street trees are needed for safety and visibility.
- Get the streets properly paved and maintained first.
- Safety is the main concern
- Encourage more outdoor dining.
- Banners across the entrances to Upper Noe Church Street corridor.
- Decorative sidewalk or pavers to give the neighborhood a nicer look.
- Consider colored utility poles for the banners instead of green black or gray.
- "I like the decorative lighting idea but I think it would be really great and stand out on all the buildings, or at least all merchant buildings, had a single strip of blue (or green) neon light across the front of the building. The area could become known as the Upper Noe Blue Light District or Green Light which could represent "open for business". This could be a highly visible memorable branding and marketing strategy to attract people to the area. People passing by (driving, walking, or public transportation) will remember it, and talk about it!"
- The lighting on 24th street looks amazing and has transformed that area.
- Decorative lighting may improve safety too.
- Benchmarks are important. Which of these ideas have aged well in other neighborhoods and other Bay Area cities. Do murals and street graphics age well? Are benches used and maintained? What does it take \$\$\$ to keep these looking good?
- How would mural art be determined?"
- How will branding projects be financed annually?
- I suggest items that don't require maintenance. Kiosks, signs, etc will get graffiti and damage
- Consider ongoing maintenance and vandalism in anything implemented
- Think about ongoing maintenance and potential for vandalism
- If benches, greenery, banners and baskets are instituted, the funding and support staff to maintain them must be guaranteed in advance.
- I like benches idea but concerned re vandalism and maintenance
- I think the benches will attract unhoused individuals, and I am not a fan of cluttering up the sidewalks with anymore things than we already have, such as phone boxes and PGE boxes, lovely, but very large planter boxes. I'd like to leave the sidewalks for pedestrians to walk on."
- I would have selected just planters if that was an Option. Benches seem to quickly become beds.
- Flower baskets are high maintenance and could be a hazard.
- Maintenance and care of the flowers must be a priority.
- Hanging planters may drip water or fall since it is windy on Church Street.
- Banners look bad over time and are an overreach.
- The last thing we need is a billboard- we are not a freeway.
- I'm not a fan of billboards but I like the idea of taking them over to promote our neighborhood.
