Parking Losses on or adjacent to Church Street: 21 (6 with meters)

Lost to Daylighting 19

Church and:

- **Day - 3 (all metered)**
- **29th - 2 (1 metered)**
- **Valley - 2 or 3 depending upon how they treat angled parking**
- **28th - 3**
- **Duncan - 2**
- **27th - 3**
- **Cesar Chavez - 2**

Lost to Bike Rack - 2 (both metered) at Church and 29th

Proposed Meters Locations

Church at 28th Street

2 on west side

4 or 5 on east side

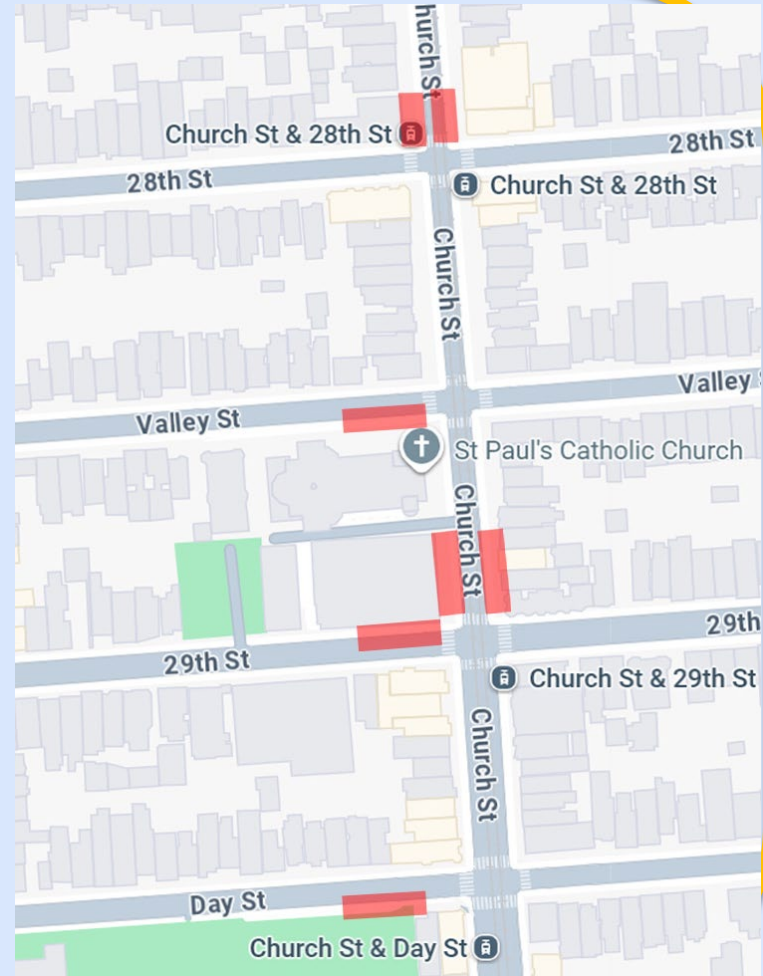
Church at 29th Street

4 on west side

5 or 6 on east side

Day Street, 29th Street, and Valley Street

5 or 6 at each location











Residential Parking Permits

**Neighbors with permits could still monopolize spaces.
(only the 72 hour rule would encourage turnover)**

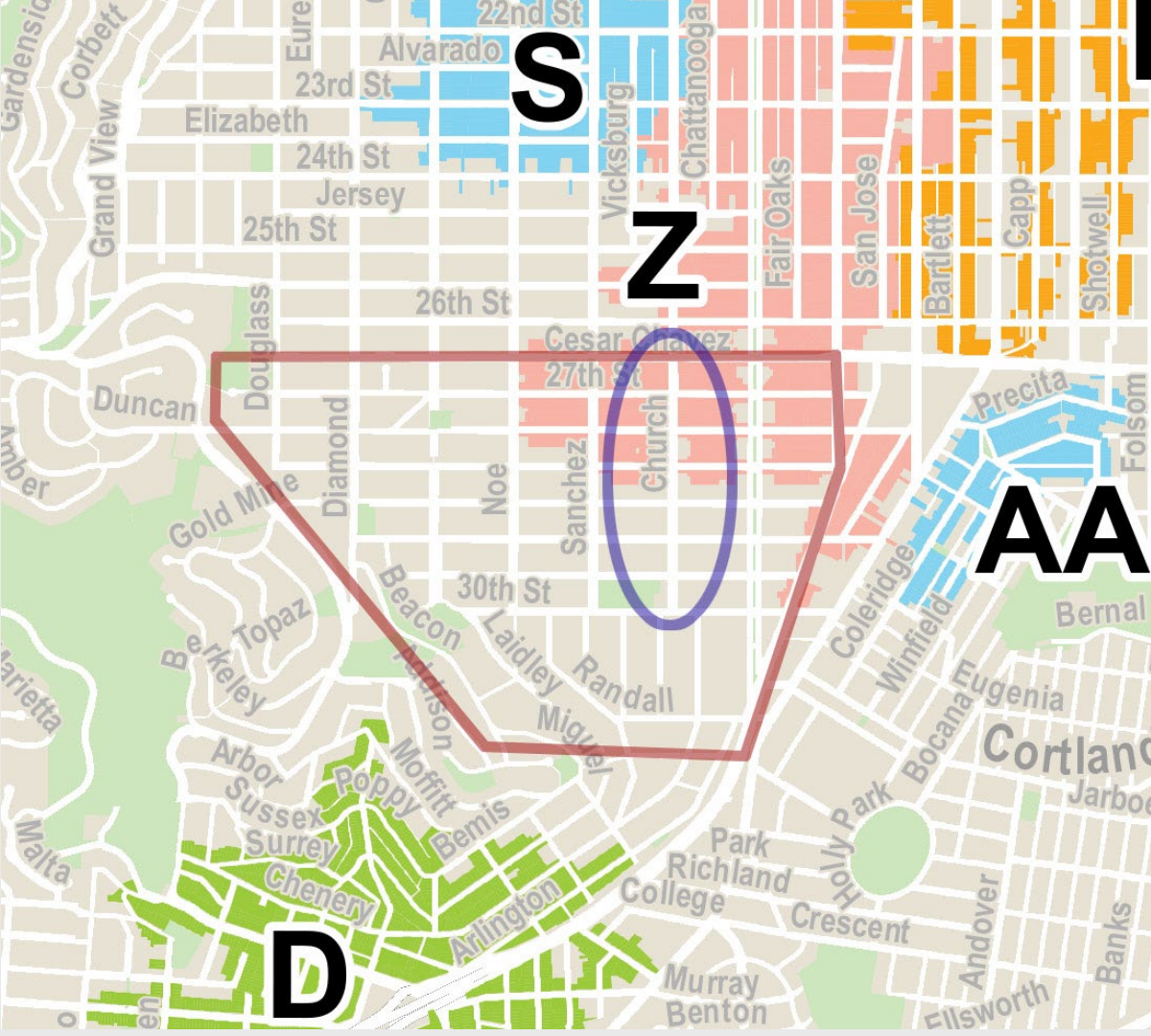
Residential Parking Permit fee = \$215 Annually

Up to 4 permits per household allowed

Business Owners get 1 permit

No stickers in most cases. Enforcement is by reading license plates.
